CHARLES² PAYNE (*JAMES*¹) was born 26 Dec 1819 in Orpington, Kent, England, and died 25 Aug 1894 in Kendall Street, Cowra (75). He married ANNE ELIZABETH FITZGERALD 06 May 1839 in St. James, Sydney rg 97/23. She was born Abt. 1813 in Limerick Arr. 9.6.1836 "Thomas Harrison" from Cork, convict 7 years sentence, and died 26 Jan 1854 in Goulburn NSW (40).

Ann Fitzgerald aged 20 years was tried in Limerick and transported to the colony on the "*Thomas Harrison*" which sailed from Cork and landed in Sydney Cove on the 9th June 1836, with 112 female prisoners, 29 children and 11 free women, wives of prisoners and 24 children. Ann was assigned to Thomas Lethbridge at Maitland NSW.

Her convict indent describes Anne age 23 years, able to read only, she was Catholic and single. She was a native of Limerick Ireland and occupation was a laundress, nursemaid. The offence she committed was that of stealing a cloak and she received a 7 years sentence at the trial held at Limerick City. Anne was 5ft 1½ inches tall, with a ruddy freckled complexion, grey to blue eyes, brown hair, she had no marks or scars. She received her certificate of freedom 1842/659.

CHARLES PAYNE:

Charles arrived on the Bounty ship "*James Pattison*" which sailed into Sydney Cove on 11th December 1837; he was 19 year of age at the time of sailing. His occupation was listed as a groom, his certificate proof of age of was signed by the local Vicar William Townley, the certificate of character was signed by James Martin –Minister and Henry Chapman – school master. He was able to read and write and of the Protestant faith.

Witnesses to their marriage were Standish Barn Castle and Elisha Hayes. Their residence was listed as Alexandria and they were married with permission of the Governor as Elizabeth was not yet free.

Receiving a stolen cheque

Goulburn Quarter Sessions
Wednesday September 20, 1865

Before Judge Meymott

Charles Payne was charged with stealing a cheque for £3./13/6d. A second count charged prisoner with receiving the same, knowing it to be stolen.

The cheque in question was stolen by the bushrangers from Mr. Morriss's store at Binda, on the 26th or 27th of December last. Some time after Inspector Roberts came across the bushrangers at a house at the Crookwell NSW, belonging to Alfred Cramp, prisoner's son-in-law. The prisoner was there at the time. The police were on foot, and the bushrangers mounted their horses and got off, prisoner's sister first shaking hands with Dunn. Shortly after the prisoner stayed for a night at Sigg's public house, at Pejar, and paid Mrs. Siggs with a cheque which he stated was one of Mr. Oakes's, but Mrs. Siggs, being unable to read, could not of her own knowledge say by whom it was drawn. It was, however, clearly for the amount in question. Some days after Mrs. Siggs paid the cheque to Mr. Emanuel; and it afterwards returned from the bank as being a stolen cheque.

Prisoner was apprehended in Goulburn, and he then stated that he got the cheque from a man named Wilson, at the Crookwell NSW, whom he did not know, and didn't think anyone else knew.

Mr. Walsh, in defence, contended that the cheque stolen from Morriss's had not been identified as that paid by the prisoner to Mrs. Siggs, although he admitted that it was the document now before the court.

Mr. Forbes replied, and his honour having summed up, the jury retired.

While considering the verdict, and while the succeeding case was being proceeded with Byrne, one of the jury in the Payne case was mentioned as having conveyed a message from the prosecutor, and the judge called Byrne from the jury room and questioned him on the subject.

After a short absence the jury found the prisoner guilty of receiving.

Mr. Walsh gave notice that in the morning he should apply for a new trial, on the grounds that his Honour having called Mr. Byrne from the jury room amounted to a separation of the jury. The prisoner was remanded for sentence.

Thursday September 21, 1865

Charles Payne, convicted on the previous day of receiving a stolen cheque, was sentenced to ten years hard labour on the roads.

On Sunday last an affray occurred between the Police and the bushrangers, which has not been made public, though the news reached reporters last week. It seems that Hall, Gilbert and Dunn called at Alfred Cramp's farm, on the Crookwell NSW, near Binda in this district, and ordered dinner. While the party of Police headed by an Inspector, whose name has not transpired, and Detective Jagers, and numbering five in all, including one or two volunteers. They were perceived by the bushrangers or by someone on the lookout, and the Police perceiving that this was the case, dismounted, as there were some fences between them and the house. They then rushed up on foot, but too late to prevent the bushrangers mounting horses. Several shots were exchanged but the bushrangers escaped.

(One of the volunteers was later reported to be William Eldridge of Binda)

The Bushrangers

Mr. Kimberley has sent word to town that the money supposed to have been taken from his lad by the bushrangers on Thursday last was found on the following morning. A great many reports have been flying about since Saturday with respect to the whereabouts of the bushrangers; but none of them are very reliable, and several have been found to be erroneous. In one case three policemen in disguise, and in another three travellers were mistaken for Hall and his gang. One of the parties of police who are in search of the bushrangers is accompanied by a young gentleman as a volunteer. We have information that on Sunday week last an affray occurred between the police and the bushrangers, and which hitherto has not been made public though the news reached reporters last week. It seems that Hall, Gilbert and Dunn called at Alfred Cramp's farm, on the Crookwell NSW, near Binda, in this district, and ordered dinner. While there a party of police headed by sub-inspector, whose name has not transpired, and Detective Jagers, and numbering in all five, including one or two volunteers, approached the house. They were perceived by the bushrangers or by some one on the look out, and the police perceiving that this was the case dismounted, as there were some fences between them and the house. They then rushed up on foot; but too late to prevent the bushrangers mounting their horses. Several shots were exchanged and the bushrangers escaped. With reference to an opinion lately expressed - that news which appears in the papers must be furnished by the persons whose names are mentioned - it may be stated that this does not by any means necessarily follow; and on the contrary it generally happens that the persons whose names appear in print have not in any way communicated with the reporters. It is not likely that the opinion referred to is generally held; and it is surprising that it should be entertained in any quarter; but as it has been recently expressed the present opportunity is taken of showing that it is erroneous

Before the Police Magistrate at Goulburn on Monday the 8th was Alfred Cramp, charged with assaulting Mrs. O'Brien, wife of John O'Brien, at O'Brien's Public House at Binda. The assault was of somewhat aggravated nature. Cramp was sent to Goulburn Goal for two months.

ALFRED CRAMP:

Alfred Cramp was born at Bomber, Mulgowrie, Abercrombie on April 21 1838, a son of Jury Cramp and his wife Mary Ann Edmunds. Jury at that time was employed as a farrier for Thomas Hassall, who had a land holding at Mulgowrie. Not a lot is known about Alfred's early childhood but he was known to get into a few scrapes in his early years before he settled down. He married Elizabeth 'Louisa' Payne at Forbes NSW on April 28, 1862. Louisa was the daughter of Charles Payne and Ann Elizabeth Fitzgerald.

Alfred was at the gold fields with his brother George, seeking their fortunes and this maybe where Alfred met Louisa as she was known to be there with her father Charles.

Alfred was at several gold diggings, Tuena 1854, Lambing Flats (now Young), North Lead and Forbes. From these pursuits it is assumed he was successful enough to allow himself to settle down and pursue farming at Binda and to raise his young family.

This was not to prove as uneventful as we are led to believe. The Goulburn Herald was to report Ben Hall Gang called on Alfred Cramp after the shooting of Constable Nelson at Collector.

Alfred moved to Cowra where he became the publican of 'The Great Western' and 'Royal' Hotels, and apart from remembering to register the brand for his sheep, remained trouble free.

He died at Cowra on September 1, 1904, following an attack of appendicitis. Louisa remained in Cowra with her family till her death on April 25, 1923. Both were buried in the Church of England section of the Cowra cemetery, beside Louisa's father, Charles Payne.

Alfred was often figured in wrangles over hotel licences & clean premises. He had lost a finger in a shooting accident. He was a champion middleweight boxer & people tried to get him to fight overseas in his younger days, but he declined the offer.

Police Court

Police V Alfred Cramp, for using unrecorded brand for sheep. Defendant stated that some three years ago he made an application to the inspector for the use of such brand, and had remitted the fees; since which time he had heard no more about it, and thought the brand was registered. The case was adjourned to the next court (20 October, 1884) to admit of defendant producing evidence.

Alfred Cramp was sued by the police for using an unregistered sheep brand. This case had been postponed from last court upon the representation of Cramp, that he made an application and remitted fee to the sheep inspector at Carcoar, and he now produced a certificate under the brand of J.W West, sheep inspector, Carcoar, showing that the brand had been allotted. Case dismissed.

Remanded accordingly, Alfred Cramp, licensee of the Royal Hotel appeared upon summons, charged with allowing billiards to be played on his premises an hour after the hour of 11 P.M. on the 17th instant.

Defendant pleaded guilty;

Constable Tranter deposed that he observed the billiard room attached to the defendants hotel, open at 12 midnight on Tuesday, 17th instant ; he questioned the person in charge, but did not caution the defendant personally, there were people playing in the room at the time.

Sergeant Harvey deposed that this was the first offence the licensee had been charged with.

Defendant said he was in bed at the time.

His Worship said that he had no option but to inflict a fine of 2 pounds that being the minimum penalty under the licensing act.

Fined £2 pounds, and 4 shillings costs, in default levy and distress.

THE LATE MR ALFRED CRAMP, SENR

A resident of many years in the person of Mr. Alfred Cramp, we much regret to record, died at his residence on Saturday night after a very brief illness, the result of an attack of appendicitis. About four years ago the first symptoms of failing health manifested themselves, and some months later he removed to

Sydney NSW, where he underwent a successful operation. About three years ago he returned to Cowra and since then, up to within a week or two of the fatal seizure, he apparently enjoyed excellent health, consequently few were prepared for the sad news that he had breathed his last. Our late townsman was born at Berbor, in the Carcoar district on April 21st 1838, therefore he was in his 67th year. In his early days he chiefly followed mining pursuits, and in the course of his peregrinations in quest of the precious metal he visited the Lambing Flat (Young) and Forbes goldfields. At the latter place in 1862 he married Miss Louisa Payne, of Goulburn, who survives him, and eventually settled down in the Goulburn district, where he was a successful grazier for a number of years. He commenced his career as a hotelkeeper in Cowra at the Great Western Hotel in 1888, and upon that hostelry becoming too small for his very large business connection, he removed to the Royal Hotel, where he conducted a large and lucrative business until the precarious state of his health necessitated his retirement into private life. He leaves a widow and grown-up family of six sons and three daughters to mourn the loss of a most affectionate husband and parent. The remains were interred in the Church of England portion of the cemetery on Sunday, in the presence of a very large number of sympathising friends and mourners. The burial service was read by Mr. A W Marshall, the Rev R Seymour Smith being away from home at the time. We tender the sorrowing family our deepest sympathy.

Then moved to Cowra and purchased the "Great Western", then the "Royal Hotel" proprietor which they carried on for many years and the premises still remains in the family today. During that time a beggar was never allowed to go away hungry and many a meal found its way to the homes of the poorer classes of the town.

James Martin appeared on remand to answer a charge of cattle stealing. Hannah Cramp deposed; I live near Tuena, and have cattle of my own. I have some working bullocks branded HC. I know William Jones, I do not know the prisoner. On one occasion I exchanged a white working bullock with William Baker, it had the HC brand on it, I have several times lent Baker bullocks to work. I never authorised him to lend them to anyone else.

The prisoner was remanded till three o'clock, when, Hannah Cramp further deposed; I have seen the three bullocks in the paddock, one is the one I changed with Baker.

Susan McClung deposed; I live at the last River, I know the bullock red and white branded HC, I heard Baker say that he had exchanged it with the prisoner, prisoner used to live at my place. I had seen Baker working the bullock on his own farm. The prisoner was discharged.

William Baker was brought up by Senior-Constable O'Brien on suspicion of stealing a brown horse branded IM on near shoulder. The prisoner gave an account of how he became possessed of the horse, and was discharged.

Harbouring Bushrangers and Receiving Stolen Property

William Jury Baker appeared at the bar on this charge. James Clunes, who had been upon bail on a similar charge, appeared when called, and took his place beside the defendant.

Robert Kennedy, Mounted trooper, deposed that, from information he had received, he apprehended Baker with a pair of knee-boots (produced in court) upon him, and he now charged him with having received the boots knowing them to have been stolen.

Before the case against Baker was proceeded with the police-magistrate said that although he did not think there was evidence to implicate James Clunes, he could not divest his mind of the belief that he must have known something about the boots found in his house; and he cautioned Clunes to be more wary and careful in future as to what he admitted within his premises. Clunes was then discharged.

In answer to a question from the bench as to whether a warrant had been issued for the apprehension of Bartholomew Clunes upon a charge of receiving stolen property, Mr. Gannon stated that Bartholomew Clunes would have been present had it been possible for him to have completed the journey; his horse had knocked up on the road, which had delayed him. He would, however, be forthcoming when wanted. Mr.

Gannon also requested that the bench would direct a subpoena to issue, and conveyed by the policeman who took the warrant, and served upon Thomas Frost, who was a material witness for the defence. Frost had refused to attend unless served with a subpoena.

The bench consented to this arrangement provided that Frost's residence was in the route which would be taken by the officer who took the warrant. Mr. Gannon said that the policeman would pass close to Frost's door on his route.

The case of William Baker was then proceeded with. Thomas Jones deposed; I am in the employ of the police; I have known the prisoner for five years; before I was in the employ of the police I was in company with the prisoner; we were camped together in the bush near Harris's place, and were going to get work at Lodge's; the prisoner proposed to change boots with me; he had on a pair of knee-boots which he said were troublesome to get off and on. I exchanged with him and gave him a pair of short Wellington for his, he told me that the knee-boots had been made for him by a shoemaker who lived near Gunning; I wore the boots for two or three days at Lodge's; we were in a hut immediately facing Lodge's house which had been used for a schoolroom; When I left Lodge I left those boots in the hut; there was no door to the place; about a month after I saw Baker wearing the same boots; I had no particular conversation with him relative to the boots. I said that they were mine, and asked him for them; he said he had not any others to wear, and gave him a pair I was wearing; I afterwards gave the boots up to Constable Kennedy.

To Mr. Gannon; He told me that the boots were made for him by a shoemaker near Gunning. Constable Hughs deposed to having apprehended the witness Jones, and having kept him in custody for about a month after his apprehension, at which time he was employed by the police; was present when they met Baker with the boots in question on him; in consequence of what he was told by Jones, took Baker into custody; the boots produced in court were the boots alluded to.

Thomas Kimberley deposed; I am a publican and storekeeper; I live at Collector; on the 26th of January last my house was struck up by three men; They were not disguised in any way; I saw them plainly; they robbed me of a good deal of property, amongst which were three pairs of riding boots, and some short wellingtons, I identify the two pairs of boots shown to me as two of three pairs which were stolen by the robbers at the time I mention; I made the boots myself and cannot make any mistake about them.

Mr. Gannon declined to cross-examine the witness and the case for the prosecution closed.

Mr. Gannon then contended that the only evidence which could criminate Baker was that of Jones, which, unsupported as it was in the main features upon which a committal could be supported, could not be believed. He appeared in the questionable attitude of a receiver of stolen property himself; he had admitted that he had been apprehended for a stolen saddle; he had then turned informer, in which character he now appeared; he also trusted that the bench would consider the equivocating manner in which he had given his evidence, and give the defendant the benefit of any doubt on the matter.

The police-magistrate said that there appeared to him to be a prima facie case made out against the prisoner; the boots were sworn to by the maker from whom they were taken by the bushrangers; it was distinctly sworn that these boots were first seen after the robbery in the possession of Baker, and he had not accounted for their possession. It was a case in which he would not take upon himself to judge, and he should commit the prisoner to take his trial at the Quarter sessions to be held at Goulburn on the 18th September next.

Mr. Gannon applied that the prisoner might be charged upon bail for his appearance at the quarter sessions.

The bench admitted the prisoner to bail, and Mr. Richard Waite of Goulburn, and Mr. Charles Baker of Binda, having given their bail, the prisoner was allowed to go at large. The young man William Jury Baker has not yet attained his eighteenth year.

James Eldridge, William Eldridge, William Baker, William McDonald, and Benjamin Cramp, were charged with cattle stealing. The three first named prisoners had been remanded from the previous Tuesday, when;-

Senior Sargeant Fenton deposed to the apprehension of the prisoners on a charge of stealing a portion of a beast, the property of Mr. Jeffreys, of Cotta Walla; witness asked if they had come through Cotta Walla, and if they all belonged to the three teams then standing in the street, asked if they had camped at Jeffreys' place; they said yes; asked if they had any fresh beef; they said a little ; took them to the lockup. William Eldridge got a bag off one of the drays which contained some beef; he said that he brought it from home ; he had some more in the dray which they got from Baker's;

Mr. McDonald said that the beef was on his dray ; subsequently found some beef on Bakers dray - nearly the whole of another hind quarter; then arrested all five prisoners.

On the present occasion Mr. Gannon appeared for the defence.

Senior Sergeant Fenton deposed to finding a powder flask and pistol, claimed by Cramp, in Baker's dray.

Remanded to the next day.

Friday, August 24, 1866

Before Police Magistrate and Misters Hovell and Rossi;

James Eldridge, William Eldridge, William Baker, William McDonald and Benjamin Cramp, appeared on remand charged with cattle stealing.

Mr. Gannon for the defence.

John Jeffreys deposed that he is a farmer living at Cotta Walla; knew Baker, but not the other prisoners; on the 11th instant a man whom he thought was Cramp came and asked him to sell him some meat, but witness had none, just before this had seen a cow of his that this man also could have seen; missed on Monday; on Tuesday, in consequence of what was told him, went to look at camp; found where some cattle bones had been recently burnt; about a quarter of a mile off found concealed in a hollow tree the fore quarter of a beast with the hide on, like the colour of the missing cow; close by found some blood where an animal had apparently been slaughtered; the head of the beast was attached to the quarter, and was the head of the missing cow; twenty yards off found the other fore quarter; witness's brand on this quarter; had seen some beef in the possession of the police - two hind quarters of a cow; the cow appeared to have been killed with the blow of an axe. On cross-examination witness said that he did not know that the place had been used as a camp before, but had heard that Baker had once camped there, on looking more closely at prisoners believed that it was James Eldridge, not Cramp, who came to his place.

John Bryant deposed that McDonald came to ask about buying meat; had seen McDonald, Baker, and James Eldridge going towards their drays. The rest of witness's evidence merely confirmed that of Jeffreys.

The prisoners were discharged, the police-magistrate remarking that he felt morally sure that the animal had been killed by one or other of them, but that there was not sufficient legal evidence to justify a committal.

Mrs. Baker, relict of the late William Baker, a very old and respected resident of Laggan, died at her residence on the afternoon of Friday last, at the ripe old age of 75 years.

The deceased was a native of Goulburn & the daughter of the late Mr. & Mrs. Payne of Tuena. Her husband predeceased her about 20 years ago. The deceased lady had been in failing health for some time past, but it was only a week previous to her death that her illness took a serious turn, and though everything was done for her that medical skill could devise and good nursing accomplish, she succumbed to heart failure on the date mentioned.

She is survived by five sons and three daughters to mourn the loss of a good mother. The sons are Messrs. Alex, Joseph, George, Guilford (Laggan) and Jack (Roslyn). The daughters are Mrs. Fogarty (Wagga) Mrs. Thorley (Laggan) and Mr. C. Thornton (Crookwell NSW). Two sons predeceased her, one (Aubrey) having been killed in the late war.

The funeral which was largely attended, took place on Sunday afternoon, when the remains were interred in the C.E. section of the Crookwell NSW cemetery, the burial service being conducted by Reverend S. Broadfoot.

The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs Kennedy & Thurkettle, local undertakers.

KILLED IN ACTION In November last Mrs. M Baker, of Laggan, was notified by the Military authorities that her son, Private A Baker, was killed in action on the 12th October. Mrs. Baker is now in receipt of a letter from Capt G R Porter, of the 11th Light Trench Mortar Battery, as follows: 'I have to convey to you the deepest sympathy of all members of this unit, and also my appreciation of your son as a soldier under my command.

Through the Red Cross Information Bureau, Gun J E Wilesmuth writes: I did not actually see the casualty, but I saw him soon after. He was caught by a shell, death being instantaneous. Refer to Cpl Riley; he was with him at the time of the casualty, and can give all particulars. I knew Pte A Baker very well, he was the only man of that name in the Battery. I was gassed soon after myself and do not know the place of burial and cannot refer to anyone for detail. The ground was held and he was sure to be buried somewhere near the place of casualty. Cpl Riley writing through the same source says: I was in charge of a party one night, Pte Baker being one of the members, and was sitting besides me. I attended all the wounded men on the occasion, and am under the impression Pte Baker was killed. I was wounded myself at the time, and went to hospital before the men were buried. Rev F W Wray, Senior CofE Chaplain of Administrative Headquarters in answer to a letter from Mrs. Baker states: I have written to Chaplain Rev R H Pitt-Owen, who is attached to the Battalion asking him to endeavour to ascertain any particulars he can surround your son's death. I will forward these particulars to you if any are forthcoming. Should it be possible for our official photographer to obtain a photograph of your son's grave, two prints will be sent you.'

Jury Cramp stated he supplied Keegan with rum as he said he was sick. He added that Keegan did not come to the premises, but was handed it on the footpath.

Supplying an Aboriginal with liquor
A Cowra Hotel keeper Charged

Case Again Adjourned in Spite of Defendants Attorney's Protest

Ada Muir, licensee of the Great Western Hotel, was charged before Mr. Longfield, S.M, on Wednesday, with allowing liquor to be supplied to an Aboriginal.

Mr. Gilcrest for defendant, who pleaded not guilty.

Constable Sams deposed that at 10.35 am on September 12, he was on duty in Lachlan Street, saw Thomas Coe, a half cast aboriginal, enter the bar of the Great Western Hotel ; went inside and saw Jury Cramp standing behind the bar ; Coe was standing in front of the bar with a glass of beer in front of him ; said to Coe "Why did you come in here after a drink" ? He made no reply ; said to Cramp "Why did you serve Coe with a drink" ? He replied, " I forgot all about it " ; said "You'll more than likely hear more about this"; Thomas Delaney, a resident of Lachlan street, Cowra, was also standing at the bar with a glass of beer in front of him ; had not seen Delaney since Coe lived at Erambie Mission.

To Mr. Gilcrest ; can see that Coe has aboriginal blood in him ; have known him 18 months or two years ; Coe has been away from Cowra a week or two during that time ; he told me he lived at the Mission ; have seen him there ; have not seen people there who don't belong to the Mission.

To the Police ; Coe was not injured or ill and did not produce a Dr's certificate.

Thomas Coe deposed he was an aboriginal residing at West Cowra ; had been residing on the Erambie Mission reserve about 12 months ; was a married man with a family ; they all resided on the reserve ; on September 12 , was in the company with a man named Delaney ; went with him to the Great Western Hotel and had a drink of beer ; Delaney paid for it ; Jury Cramp served them ; remembered Constable Sams came in ; was a half cast aboriginal.

To Mr. Gilcrest ; My father was a quarter cast ; my mother died when I was young ; I don't know what she was.

Sergeant Lenon deposed he was guardian of the aborigines at Cowra ; furnish returns in connection with the aborigines ; have copies of some ; reserve No 11,634, of 3 acres, 1 rod, 9 perch was set aside for the use of aborigines.

D.M Reed, C.L.A. for Cowra Land District, produced a map of the parish of Cowra showing a reservation for the use of aborigines.

Mr. Gilcrest ; I object.

S.M ; It doesn't seem to be the correct way of proving it.

Sergeant Lenon ; I'll have to ask for an adjournment then.

Mr. Gilcrest ; I cannot agree to it. It's not our fault, We prepared to go on at the last court.

S.M. ; I think I'll have to grant the adjournment. It was adjourned at your request on one occasion.

Mr. Gilcrest ; It's hard on my client.

S.M. An adjournment can't do any damage, and it's only a technical objection.

Mr. Gilcrest ; The police should have been prepared to go on.

S.M. ; I'm aware of that, I know if it had been my case I'd have had the gazette here.

Mr. Gilcrest ; It is very unfair that we should be saddled with costs. The police should not be protected anymore than the public.

Sergeant Lenon ; We can prove Coe has been living at the Mission.

Mr. Gilcrest ; I'd ask your Worship for a dismissal.

S.M ; I don't think the map is sufficient evidence, Can a gazette be procured locally ?

Sergeant Lenon ; It might be possible , but if the case is adjourned it cannot effect anyone.
Mr. Gilcrest ; The case should be adjourned.
S.M ; I'll adjourn the case until October 11.
A case against Jury Cramp in connection with the same matter was also adjourned.

Local Hotel keeper Fined

The adjourned case in which Ada Laura Muir, licensee of the Great Western Hotel, was charged with allowing an aboriginal to be served with liquor, was concluded before Mr Longfield, S.M, on Tuesday.

Sergeant Lenon produced a Government Gazette dated June 7, 1890, showing a proclamation re Reserve No 11,364, county of Forbes, parish of Mulyan ; the aboriginal was living on that reserve ; to witness's knowledge Coe had been living on the reserve when not away at work.

Mr Gilcrest submitted there was no evidence to identify the reserve as being the one referred to in the Gazette.

Sergeant Lenon ; There is only one aboriginal reserve here.

Mr Gilcrest ; There was no evidence given at the last court.

S.M ; The evidence has been given today though !

Mr Gilcrest ; If you overrule me in that I take the point that there is no proof Coe is an aboriginal native of NSW

S.M ; He says himself he is an aboriginal native of Australia.

Mr Gilcrest ; Yes, but there is no proof either he or his parents are aboriginal natives.

S.M ; Have you any authorities ?

Mr Gilcrest ; There is a case in 27 weekly notes. However I'll have that for the present. My client is charged with allowing liquor to be supplied to an aboriginal. There is no evidence of that.

S.M ; In the case of ex - parte Willans it was held the licensee was liable if his wife served in his absence.

Mr Gilcrest ; In this case it is the barman, and he couldn't be presumed to have the same authority as a wife.

S.M ; Under section 81 the chief Justice says the licensee is liable or any person he leaves in charge.

Mr Gilcrest ; There is no evidence of that. There's nothing to show that Cramp had any authority.

S.M ; Constable Sams asked Cramp why he served Coe and he replied " I forgot all about it". The fact that he was serving in the bar is sufficient unless it is shown he was there with out authority, I won't dismiss the information on that ground.

Mr Gilcrest ; I'll ask for my objection to be noted.

S.M ; Very Well.

Sergeant Lenon ; I'd refer your Worship to the case of Beer v Lynch. On December 2, 1919, defendant was fined for allowing unauthorised persons on her licensed premises, and she was fined 5 pounds later on for a like offence.

S.M ; How is the Hotel conducted ?

Sergeant Lenon ; It is a very quite place. Aboriginals have easy access there and being very slippery customers are hard to catch.

S.M ; There is also a charge against Cramp ?

Sergeant Lenon ; We're prepared to withdraw it.

S.M ; She's fined 5 pounds, with 8 shillings costs, 14 days are allowed to pay and half the fine is to go to the police Rewards Fund

The sudden death of Mr James Aubrey "Jum" Baker, late of 151 Denison St, Finley, on Friday ,21st July, 1978, came as a great shock to his family and many friends.

James Baker was one of Finley's most esteemed residents. He was born at Laggan NSW, the eldest son of Jack and Charlotte Baker of Sydney NSW and latterly of Mulwala and was one of a family of four. He married Edna May Hodder at Cowra on 21st May , 1932 and first came to the district in 1938. With his wife and family he set up residence in Denison St and worked on the establishment of his home and garden.

During the war years he worked at Tocumwal aerodrome, Garden Island and Cockatoo Island in the dock yards in Sydney NSW Harbour and at the Lithgow small arms factory. A conscientious and diligent worker he was employed with the Water Resources Commission for many years until his retirement on 21st July 1975.

Sports were of interest since James's early days in the area. He was a very keen follower of the Finley Football Club in earlier years, a committee member for ten years and also a foundation member of the Finley Gymnasium Club. He held the position of treasurer until the club disbanded.

Many of his leisure hours were spent in his beloved garden and in maintenance of his home, but he was a very keen fisherman and travelled to Wilcannia several times a year for this purpose. The high regard in which he was held among his fellows was apparent in the number of fishing associates who travelled to Finley to attend his funeral.

James Baker, of quiet and undemanding nature, was a family man and lived for those interests in the main, but was always willing to offer assistance to those in need. He made and retained many friends in various Centre throughout his lifetime.

He is survived by his wife, daughters Gwen (Mrs. Jack Martin, Berrigan) Elaine (Mrs. Len Koschel, Finley), by grandchildren, Elizabeth and Shaun Martin of Berrigan and Robert and Gregory Koschel of Finley. His mother, Mrs. Baker of Sydney NSW and two sisters Thora (Mrs. Shaw, Brisbane) and Sylvia(Mrs. Armstrong, Sydney NSW) also survive him. His son Noel, Father John, and brother William predeceased him.

Cannon Joseph officiated for the service at Holy Trinity Church of England on Monday 24th July, and the funeral was to the Lawn portion of the Finley Cemetery. Pall bearers were Joe Connell, Kevin Huntington, Bill Ryan , Robert Haynes, Geoff Trevarrow and Ray Murphy.

Edna May BAKER: was the fourth born to Frances Hines & James Hodder. She was born on 3rd July 1914 at Cowra NSW

Her early years were spent growing up on the family property & schooling was in the same area at Porters Mount. Her brother, Leonard would drive them all to school in a horse & gig, many times playing tricks on each other on the way home.

One day ,when on their way home from school, Leonard wanted to get home quicker than normal. They were about half way between the school & the farm, when the old horse started to slow down. Leonard pulled the gig up under a low hanging branch of a tree & asked Eileen to grab the branch & break a twig of it so he could use it as a whip. Eileen proceeded to do so , as she grabbed the branch Leonard let fly with a very loud whistle & the old horse bolted . Eileen was left hanging in the tree as the gig continued on it's way home. Eileen arrived home about 20 minutes later, her new dress had been ripped from the waist to the hem. The dress had become caught on the seat of the gig & as Leonard took of in the gig it ripped her dress. Leonard was punished for his trick , he had to clean out the pig's pen for a month.

Edna helped with the chores on the farm & also cooked meals for an ill uncle, Bill Hines, who lived near by. Edna's parents moved to Wyangala Dam shortly after the death of Amy, as there was plenty of work available with the construction of a weir at the mouth of the dam.

In 1931 Edna meet James Baker, who was also working on the construction site. They married in Cowra ,on 21st May 1932 & on 31st October of that year their first child, a son, Noel was born at Cowra. James was still working at Wyangala, while Edna was living in Cowra attending to her new born. On 31st October 1934 , Edna gave birth to their 2nd child, a daughter, Gwendoline, exactly 2 years after the birth of Noel.

The family moved to Mulwala after the work at Wyangala Dam had finished. James was employed by his father , who had a milk delivery run & also had a timber logging business ,on the other hand his mother ran a boarding house.

On 1st February 1937, Elaine Margaret was born. Edna did not tell her family that a third child was expected , as Doctors told her it could be life threatening.

In 1939 the Construction of the Mulwala channel started. James worked on this project from start to finish. The family lived in a make shift home , moving along the route of the channel as it was completed.

On reaching Finley , the family settled & purchased land. This was to become their home town. The 2 acres of land was at the southern end of the town & had permits available to sub divide. James started to build a home, which was constructed out of the remains of an old building that had been a store in Warmatta St, Finley. In 1952 the house was completed & they were able to move in.

Many hours were spent in the garden , as well as holding down full time jobs.

Edna was working at the Finley Dry Cleaners, for the Hayes brothers from Deniliquin., James had taken a position at the Water Commission as a Fitter & turner.

Edna & James son , Noel, was killed in an accident between a train & car , at Tocumwal, on 19th July 1955. This left Edna with 2 daughters, who both married within 18 months of Noels death.

Edna became a Grandmother on 26th June 1958, with the birth of Elaine's first child, Robert. Over the next 4 years Edna had another 3 Grandchildren born.

The Dry cleaners was sold & Edna retired & spent most of her time at home, enjoying her hobbies such as handcrafts, Gardening, Fishing & having her grandchildren around her.

In 1964 she helped her brother ,Lloyd, run Berriquin Funerals, which continued until 1968. She then worked as a service station manageress , for daughter Gwen.

James retired in 1975 & they both planned to go around Australia, this was never to happen, as James's health was not the best. In 1977, while on holidays in Wilcannia ,NSW James had a very bad heart attack & Edna had to drive back to Finley after James was released from Wilcannia Hospital. This was quite a feat for Edna ,as she had to drive a ford freighter & tow a caravan.

On 21st July , James passed away in his sleep, the day after his 68th Birthday. Edna managed to maintain her home & general chores around the place as well as doing some baby sitting to fill in time & make some pocket money. Edna was a very active person for her age, in 1989 with the help of her grandson, Robert, she painted the interior & exterior of her home.

In 1991 her health was not so good, she had a few stays in hospital , but nothing seemed to be seriously wrong. She was diagnosed with stiff lung syndrome & was told to be careful not to get a chill or the flu.

On the 26th August she had an appointment down in Melbourne with a specialist ,this day was a wet & windy day. 5 days later she was taken to the hospital with the flu & was there over night. 2 days later she was taken back to hospital by ambulance & was never to come back home. She passed away at 6pm on 3rd September 1991. She had all her family around her for most of the day, but Grandson Robert stayed with her while the family went home to have a meal. The family had only been gone a few minutes when they were phoned with bad news, that she had passed away .

Edna was buried with James , in the Lawn section of the Finley Cemetery on 6th September 1991.

TRAGIC RAILWAY CROSSING ACCIDENT

Finley Mail Newspaper, Wednesday July 27, 1955

News of the tragic railway crossing accident last Wednesday in which two well known Finley men, Martin Terence Walsh and Noel Aubrey Baker, were killed, spread quickly and cast a deep gloom over the entire town and district.

Walsh and Baker were returning to Finley from Tocumwal in a utility truck driven by Walsh, when the truck collided with the motor train travelling from Finley, at the level crossing about a mile from Tocumwal.

Walsh was killed instantly and Baker, who was immediately taken by R.A.A.F ambulance to the Finley Hospital, died soon after admission.

The motor rail hit the front of the utility throwing it back against a crossing sign post from where it bounced back almost onto the line again.

Some damage was done to the train but none of the passengers were injured. The utility was very badly damaged and a dog, which was riding in the cabin, was also killed.

Another motorist, Mr J Jordan, who was travelling towards Tocumwal had pulled up at the crossing waiting for the train to pass and saw the utility approach before the collision occurred.

Detective Knight from Deniliquin is assisting Sgt Ellicott and Constable Carpenter from Tocumwal in the investigation. Also assisting is Detective Sullivan from Wagga Scientific Bureau and several railway detectives.

An inquiry into the accident will be conducted by the district coroner, Mr K.A. Edwards on August 24 at 10.30 am.

Terry Walsh, who was aged 28 years, was a well known footballer. He was among the Murray League's most accomplished players and has been a tower of strength to the Finley team for several years. He first played with Finley in 1945 and then with North Melbourne, where he was hailed as a future star and won a best and fairest trophy. Because of his father's ill health in 1950 he returned to Finley and has since played with the local team, being in the premiers side in 1952 and 1954.

Terry was vice captain of Finley this season and on one other occasion and has represented the Murray League in Victorian Country Football Championships. He won the best and fairest trophy at Finley in 1946 and again in 1953. He has always taken a keen interest in junior football and this season was coaching the Finley third eighteen.

Terry, who was born in Finley, was educated at the local convent school and at St Patrick's College, Ballarat, where he learnt his football under the well known coach Bro O'Malley. He was engaged in farming at the time of his death.

He is survived by his mother, and a wife and three children, the youngest of whom was born only a few days before his death.

Noel Baker, who was aged 22 years, was a firm friend of Terry Walsh and the two were great companions. He had only recently been discharged from Hospital following an operation and was convalescing before returning to his employment with the Water Commission and Irrigation Commission.

While he played football with the second eighteen team a few seasons ago, he was not a footballer of note. However, there are few who took a greater interest in the Finley team's doings or supported it more keenly. For several seasons he was one of the clubs trainers and could always be relied on to give any support needed.

Since leaving school in Finley, he was, until recently, employed as a baker's assistant in Finley, and was highly thought of by various employees.

He is the only son of Mr and Mrs. J. Baker, of Denison St, and brother of Misses Gwen and Elaine Baker.

Both young men were very highly regarded and well known in the town and district, and the news of their tragically sudden deaths was accompanied by a wave of great sorrow for their bereaved relatives.

The funeral of Noel Baker took place to the Church of England portion of the Finley Cemetery on Thursday afternoon, Rev Canon White officiating at the service in the church and at the grave side. Members of the R.A.O.B lodge formed a guard of honor. The casket bearers were Lloyd Hodder, Mick Armstrong, Graham Coulter, Ron Hanna, Len Lye, and Len Koschel.

After a service at St Mary's Church the funeral of Terrence Walsh took place to the Catholic portion of the Cemetery, the officiating clergyman being Fr Byrne (Tocumwal) assisted by Fr Stanley (Jerilderie) The casket bearers were Fergus and Kevin Walsh (Cousins) Pat and John Whitty, G Dalitz and Ron Hanna.

At both funerals, which were very largely attended, Finley Footballers and Club officials formed a guard of Honor as the remains were taken to their last resting places.

The football guard of Honor included representatives of all Murray League teams and also Murray league officials

LEVEL CROSSING TRAGEDY.

CORONERS INQUIRY

The District Coroner, Mr K.A. Edwards, conducted an inquiry at Finley last Wednesday concerning the deaths of Mr Martin Terrance Walsh and Mr Noel Aubrey Baker, who were killed as a result of a railway crossing accident near Tocumwal on July 20, 1955.

Sergeant McKinley appeared to assist the coroner, Mr W.A Taylor for the relatives of Baker and Mr N Barnett for the relatives of Walsh and the Government Insurance office.

Sergeant Ellicott, of Tocumwal , gave evidence to the effect that he was informed of the accident of Mr J. Jordon and went with Constable Carpenter to the scene of the accident. The body of Walsh was lying near the line and Baker was unconscious on the seat of the utility. He appeared to be seriously injured and was taken to Finley Hospital where he died shortly afterwards.

The motor utility had collided with the train, the point of impact appearing to have been on the south edge of the bitumen. Skid marks extended back about 5 feet. They were in a slightly curving direction to the left. The skid mark of the off side wheel was heavier than the near side. From the point of impact to where the vehicle was on his arrival was about 39 feet.

Evidence as to the cause of death was given by Dr C. Vear. Replying to Mr Barnett dependant, stated he could say definitely in the case of Baker that there was no evidence to support the view that he had partaken of any quantity of alcohol close to the time of the accident. In the case of Walsh there was no evidence when the examination was conducted that any quantity had been consumed.

Detective, Constable D.A. Knight gave evidence of inquiries he had made concerning the accident Evidence by J.E Crilly, of Tocumwal, was to the effect that he had seen the Deceased in the Bar of the Tocumwal Hotel and as far as he knew they had five middies. In reply to Mr Taylor, he said that Baker had refused a drink for the road offered by a man named Harold Murray.

The Licensee of Tocumwal Hotel stated he had seen Walsh and Baker who appeared perfectly sober, leave the hotel, get into the truck and drive away. A passenger on the train, Mr A Fear, stated that he was watching a utility travelling to Tocumwal as the train approached the crossing. The train slackened speed and whistled almost continuously. The utility pulled up. He did not see any other vehicle, but there was a crash and what he took to be a body passed the window. After the impact the train stopped about sixty yards from the crossing. Replying to Taylor he said the train was about thirty minutes late leaving Finley. He did not think the driver was trying to make up time. He would say the train was travelling about 15 to 20 miles at the crossing.

Jack Jordon stated in effect that when approaching the crossing going towards Tocumwal he saw another motor vehicle coming from Tocumwal. It was about 350 yards from the crossing when he first saw it. He could have passed over the crossing before the train got there, but stopped about 40 yards away. He noticed the other vehicle travelling straight on without seeming to vary in speed and tried to attract the attention of the driver. He was just coming to a stop when he heard the train whistle long and clear, but with the windows of a modern car closed you may not have heard it. He saw, in a momentary glance, the train and the car come into collision. He went and reported the accident at Tocumwal. In reply to Mr Barnett he said the car seemed to be capably handled.

Henry Raymond Brown, railway guard stated in effect that he had seen the car coming from Tocumwal about 300 yards from the crossing and had said to the driver(Mr Potter) that at the speeds there would be an accident. The driver blew the whistle about 160 180 yards from the crossing. The utility was about 200 or 250 yards away when the whistle was first sounded. It came on at the same speed. The whistle was sounded again and the brakes were applied about 60 or 80 yards from the crossing. The train went on about 60 yards before stopping.

In reply to Mr Taylor he said the accident happened at 2.50 P.M. The train left Finley at 2.31 P.M. To the Coroner he said that if the brakes were heavily applied the train could pull up in about 100 yards travelling at 35 to 40 miles per hour. The train driver G. H. Potter gave similar evidence. He said that the power van of the train weighed 28 ton and the trailer 22 tons unloaded and it would be doing a good job to pull up in 120 yards travelling at 35 or 40 miles per hour. He said the car hit the side of the train.

The Coroner's finding was that Martin Terrance Walsh died from injuries accidentally received when a truck driven by him and a rail motor collided at a level crossing. He found further that no blame what so ever was attached to the train crew. The evidence did not enable him to say as to whether there was any negligence on the part of the driver of the truck

His finding in regard to Noel Aubrey Baker was that the deceased died in Finley Hospital, from the result of injuries received in a collision between a utility being driven by Martin Terrance Walsh and a rail motor at a level crossing about 1 mile north of Tocumwal. He further found that there was no negligence on the part of the train crew, and also that there was no evidence of negligence on the part of the deceased.

A ROCKY outcrop over looking Berrigan racecourse is the source of 216 tonnes of granite for the restoration of the walls of St Mathews Church, Albury. Mr Jack Martin, quarry-master, has begun extracting the granite in 10 tonne blocks and should have it all to the stone masons within three months.

"We have already spudded in, cut the first block and broken it down to manageable bricks", he said, indicating his enthusiasm for the work. Mr. Martin and a helper are using bone jarring techniques with tungsten-tipped drills rather than explosives to ensure that even the finest hairline fracturing does not weaken the rock.

It will take 12 hours of drilling 128 holes in a stitching pattern(one hole abutting the next) to excavate each block and reduce it to bricks. The Altona North stonemasons, Abbey Stone Restoration , will chisel into shape and place on site. Mr. Martin, with 25 years experience in quarrying, suggested using the Berrigan granite when supplies from the pit in the Black range, above Albury, from where the original stone was quarried , became unavailable.

He recently extracted the sandstone to be used in the Church's window surrounds from a quarry at Table Top. To satisfy those concerned that the Berrigan granite would be suitable for colour and texture, he sliced a huge block from the top face of the quarry. It revealed a pinkish tinge that, after weathering, will match up very well with the existing stone.

Eight years ago, Mr Martin took a 10 year lease of the 30 ha block of land where the quarry is located after discovering the quality of the granite. It is at leased 300 m deep. He named the stone Berrigan May, for his wife.

The St Mathews job will be the first from the quarry. Mr. Martin, a motor mechanic by trade who went to Berrigan 27 years ago, learned quarrying from Mr. Ted Hudson, whose family had one of the best -known stone masonry business in Australia.

Mr. Martin has hired local labour for the demanding job of drilling. He is not perturbed about how much he will have to do himself. He is something like granite himself. He drilled the sandstone at Table Top with a splintered shin bone in one leg and a damaged cartilage in the other.
